Congressional Country Club has been the host venue for the 1964 US Open, the 1995 US Senior Open, the 1997 US Open and the 2011 US Open.

Michael is a Certified Club Manager (CCM), a certified Club Executive (CCE), a certified PGA of America and South Africa Golf Professional, a certified Tennis professional, an avid triathlete (two time Hawaii Ironman finisher), a marathon runner (40 marathons completed), fisherman, photographer and a proud member AND PAST President of the Club Managers Association of America for the past 19 years.
